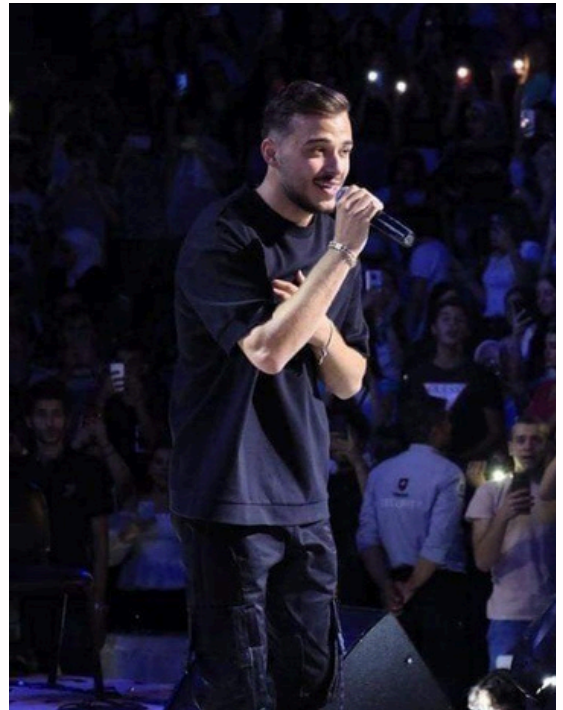

Queen Rania is the queen consort of Jordan. Rania is the patron of numerous organizations working for children's rights, healthcare, women's rights, and education.

Prince Hussein Prince Hussein was born in 1994. The prince studied history at Georgetown, is a captain in the Jordanian army, and chairs a foundation supporting Jordanian youth. In the summer of 2023, Prince Hussein married Princess Rajwa.

Princess Iman studied at the Amman International Academy (AIA). On June 4, 2014, she graduated from the AIA and received first prize in women's athletics in her category. She is currently an assistant professor at Georgetown University in Washington, DC, the same university where her brother, Crown Prince Hussein, studied.

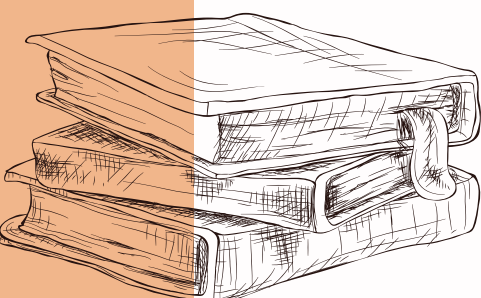

Technology

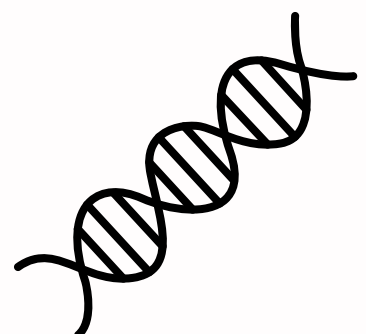

1 The ancient city of Petra: Petra, one of the New Seven Wonders of the World, was the capital of the Nabataean Kingdom. It is famous for its impressive facades carved into the pink rock. Petra was rediscovered by Swiss explorer Johann Ludwig Burckhardt in 1812 and is one of Jordan's most important tourist destinations.



2 The Dead Sea: Jordan is one of the countries that shares the shores of the Dead Sea, known for its high salinity that allows people to float effortlessly. Additionally, the Dead Sea is the lowest point on Earth, about 430 meters below sea level.
